PRESIDENT'S REPORT

IT'S MY PLEASURE TO PRESENT THE PRESIDENT'S REPORT FOR THE 2025/2026 SEASON OF THE CARINGBAH SPORTS CRICKET CLUB.

CLUB GROWTH & PARTICIPATION

Following on from last year's strong foundations, this season has seen continued growth across the club, both in participation and performance. Registrations increased from 143 to 177, a 24% lift, with particularly strong growth in Cricket Blast and U10's. That's exactly where we want to see it, and it sets the club up well for the future. It was also great to see five teams in the Cricket Blast Games program and strong involvement in the Skills program.

ON-FIELD PERFORMANCE

On the field, the results speak for themselves. We had 14 teams in the mixed junior competition, with 10 making finals, 5 finishing as Minor Premiers and 6 teams reaching Grand Finals. With 4 Premierships in total, congratulations go to our 10B1's coached by Ben Duff, 10D's coached by Simon Davies, 12A's coached by Dwayne Cocks and 14A's coached by Adam Fleming. A special mention to the 10D side, who were all new to cricket and went through the season undefeated, 20 games, 20 wins. That's an outstanding achievement. The 12D team also deserves

recognition, with most players new to cricket, finishing as Minor Premiers and just falling short in the Grand Final. We also saw a strong season from our 14A joint venture with Cronulla Seagulls, making the Grand Final.

REPRESENTATIVE HONOURS & PLAYER RECOGNITION

Congratulations to our players listed within this report who will receive club awards for batting, bowling, wicket keeping, fielding and 'Ivor Chalmers Award' recipients. Also, congratulations to those who will receive awards at the upcoming SSJCA Presentation. We had a strong representation in the SSJCA representative teams again this season as well as beyond into the SDCC Green Shield team, a wonderful reflection of the talent within our club.

A special congratulations to our 2025/26 Caringbah Sports Cricketer of the Year, Sam Everitt. As captain of our 16A's, Sam led from the front and enjoyed a great all-round season, scoring 271 runs at an average of 27.10 and taking 9 wickets at 19.22. Each season a number of our players play their final year in the U16 competition, thank you for all your contributions and loyalty. We look forward to seeing what you do next in your cricketing career.

CRICKETER OF THE YEAR

CARINGBAH SPORTS CRICKET CLUB IS PLEASED TO RECOGNISE SAMUEL EVERITT AS THE CRICKETER OF THE YEAR FOR THE 2025/26 SEASON.

A long-standing member of the club, Sam joined in 2017 as part of the inaugural Cricket Blast program. Since then, he has developed into a highly accomplished and consistent all-round cricketer. Across his junior career to date, Sam has accumulated 1,253 runs at an impressive average of 30.56, including a highest score of 82 not out with eight half-centuries. With the ball, he has claimed 46 wickets at an average of 16.17, with best figures of 4 for 20. In the field, Sam has contributed 31 catches, 8 run outs, and this season recorded his first stumping while stepping up to take on wicketkeeping duties when required.

In addition to his on-field achievements, Sam is a valued and respected teammate. His positive attitude and natural leadership have been evident throughout his junior career, culminating in his appointment as team captain over the past two seasons. Although he did not receive any individual awards this season,

Sam's consistent performances with bat (271 runs at an average of 27.10), the ball (9 wickets at an average of 19.22) and in the field (8 catches and 1 stumping) were instrumental to his team's success.

Sam has represented the Sutherland Shire Junior Cricket Association for five years, with potentially more opportunities still to come. This season, he was selected in the Sutherland District Cricket Club AW Green Shield squad and was also a member of their Metropolitan Cup Premiership winning team, where he top scored in the Grand Final.

Congratulations, Sam. Your hard work, commitment, and contribution to the club make you a most worthy recipient of this award. We thank you for everything you have given to Caringbah Sports to date and look forward to seeing your continued success in the 16A's in 2026/27.

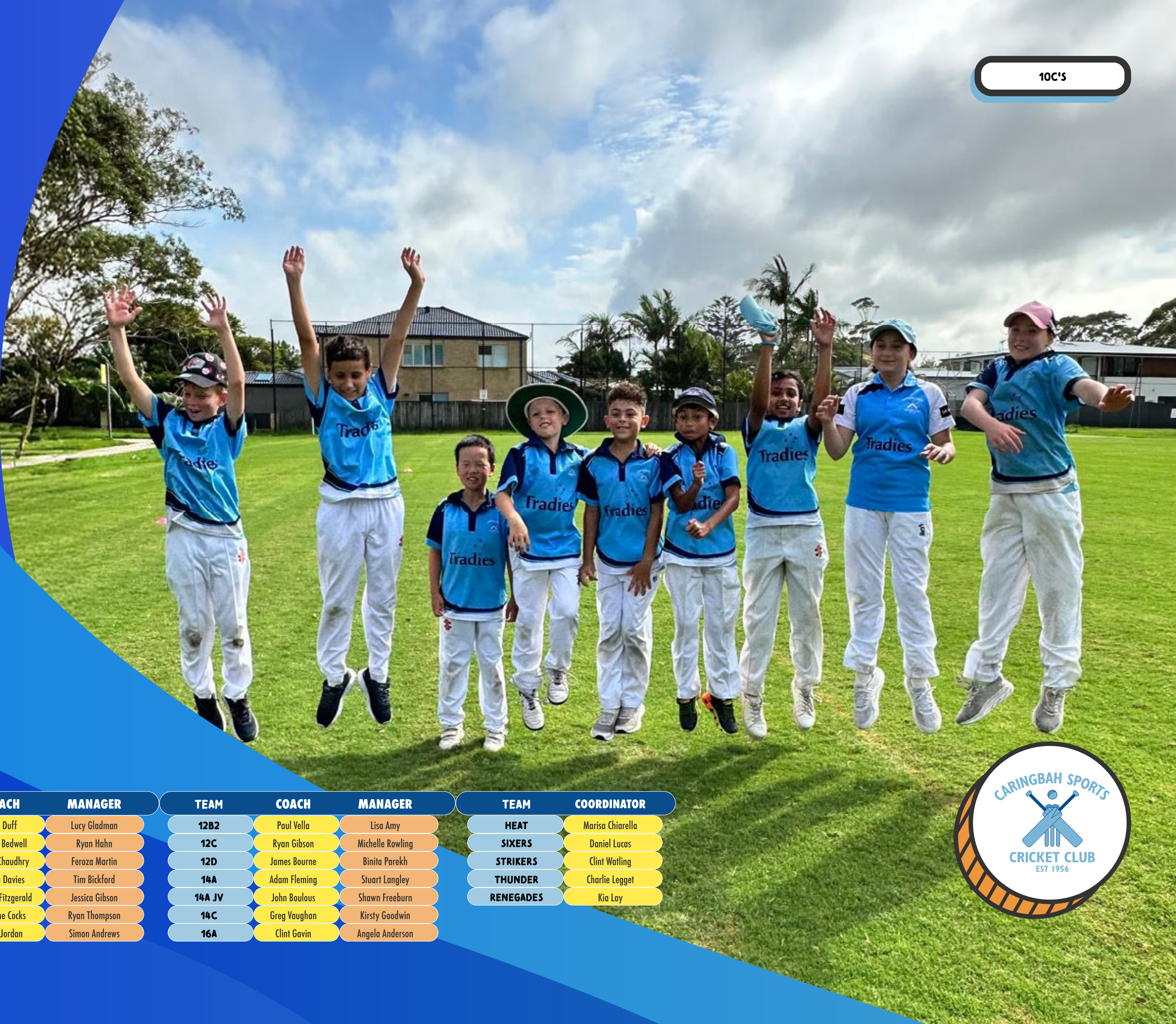

THE MIGHTY 10D’S MARCHED THROUGH 18 ROUNDS OF THE REGULAR SEASON WITHOUT REGISTERING A LOSS AND HELD THEIR NERVE THROUGH THE FINALS SERIES TO EMERGE AS UNDEFEATED PREMIERS. FOR MANY OF THE BOYS, THIS WAS THEIR FIRST SEASON OF “REAL” CRICKET, MAKING THE ACHIEVEMENT EVEN MORE IMPRESSIVE. WHILE THE TITLE OF “UNDEFEATED PREMIERS” IS A FITTING AND RELATIVELY RARE REWARD FOR THEIR EFFORTS, WHAT WAS EVEN MORE PLEASING WAS THE IMPROVEMENT EACH OF THESE EIGHT LITTLE LEGENDS SHOWED ACROSS THE SIX MONTHS, AND THE GENUINE ENJOYMENT THEY HAD ALONG THE WAY. SATURDAY MORNINGS QUICKLY BECAME THE HIGHLIGHT OF THE WEEK FOR PLAYERS AND PARENTS ALIKE.

While the parent (and grandparent) group was tight-knit and hugely supportive of the boys, Tim and myself, special thanks must go in particular to all of the dads who were there in numbers every week at training and on game day assisting the boys. Thank you.

DANIEL BICKFORD: Opposition batsmen would quiver as Danny turned at the top of his mark. A talented fast bowler and reliable batsman, who was always in the runs. Danny never stopped competing and led by example every week. A natural sportsman and leader.

LACHLAN BOYLE: A big, powerful batsman with runs on his mind. When Lachlan wielded the willow and connected... the ball would sail over the heads of the opposition. Lachie’s bowling and fielding improved enormously as the season progressed, knocking over middle stump and taking some excellent catches late in the year.

GABRIEL DAVIES: A fierce competitor and his own toughest critic, Gabe always strived to be better. His composure at the crease, natural technique and ability to work the ball around the field were

something to look forward to each week and certainly something his old man never possessed. The accuracy of Gabe’s bowling also paid dividends, resulting in him finishing the season as the leading wicket taker and champion player of the competition.

JACK EAST: The silent assassin. Jack worked tirelessly on his batting and bowling technique and was rewarded with some terrific moments, sometimes even surprising himself. Another powerful striker of the ball, it was wonderful to see Jack’s passion for the game grow. Delivered an outswinger for the ages to take a crucial wicket in the Grand Final.

10E COACHES REPORT

THE FIRST EVER SEASON OF CRICKET FOR THIS GROUP WAS A HUGE SUCCESS AND A LOT OF FUN FOR ALL THE KIDS AND THEIR PARENTS. WE SAW HUGE IMPROVEMENT IN EVERY PLAYER, AND WE COULDN'T BE PROUDER OF THE ATTITUDE AND ENTHUSIASM OF THE GROUP. WITH MOST PARENTS AND PLAYERS NOT HAVING A LONG BACKGROUND IN CRICKET, IT WAS AMAZING TO SEE HOW QUICKLY WE PICKED UP THE SKILLS AND NUANCES OF THE GAME, ESPECIALLY BOWLING, FIELDING AND FILLING OUT THE SCORECARD!

One of the most pleasing sights every Saturday morning was standing back seeing so much support from this group of parents and the eagerness to learn and help in a largely new sport. Right throughout the season we emphasised enjoyment, effort and improvement over the result of the match, and I think we more than succeeded. The outcome of this attitude is a group of kids who enjoyed the success of their teammates as much or sometimes more than their own. Great group of kids to coach, I wouldn't change this team for anything.

ZAC AYOUB: Zac is an all-round gifted athlete, and it was no surprise to see him excel in cricket. Plenty of time spent practicing with his older brother meant he was ready from round one. I didn't expect to see him make such big leaps throughout the year, but he certainly did. Even with his season cut short with rep soccer, Zac turned up every chance he had and reminded us why we want him in every week. Zac has a very nice bowling action and hits the ball very hard to all parts of the ground, and when he wasn't involved, he was a great teammate to have on the sideline.

EAMON FITZGERALD: (By Jess Gibson) Eamon was one of the most consistent performers in the team all season, particularly with the ball, where his line and length were genuinely outstanding for an 8-year-old. He kept his extras to a minimum and gave batting sides very little to work with. With the bat he struck the ball cleanly, hit some solid fours, and ran between the wickets sharply. Fielding he was accurate and dangerous, with a strong arm and laser focus. Perhaps the best insight into Eamon's character though came when he broke his arm and still turned up to field on the boundary. He would almost certainly have found a way to bat through it if we'd let him. Happy, spirited and with a passion for cricket, we have no doubt there are many successes ahead of him.

LANA FITZGERALD: (By Jess Gibson) Lana signed up for cricket entirely off her own bat and as the only girl in the team, that decision alone says a lot about her character. She repaid that confidence in herself with a season of real improvement and dedication. Her efforts with the ball were a highlight building consistency and confidence week on week. With the bat, Lana's biggest contribution was often her voice; her clear communication in a partnership created run-scoring opportunities that others might have missed, and her teammates were better for having her at the other end. Kind, gentle and always supportive of those around her, Lana embodied everything we wanted this team to be about. We couldn't be prouder of the cricketer and teammate she became this season.

LACHLAN GIBSON: Lachie is just about the keenest and most competitive young cricketer I've met. Batted and bowled well all season and even though he has enough natural talent, Lachie was always listening and wanting to learn at training and in games so that he would keep getting better. Lachie would often release a rocket from nowhere that would bounce well over the stumps and if he continues practicing, he's got the makings of a real fast bowler. In the field his accuracy and speed with his left arm kept batters on their toes and with the bat he rarely played an innings where he didn't find the boundary. Lachie deals mostly in 4s but always snuck extra singles and took advantage of napping fielders, he was always consistent with the bat.



HARRY HABOJAN: Not only was Harry the most improved player in the team, but he also finished the season as one of our best bowlers and very good with the bat in hand, finding the boundary consistently on both sides of the wicket. Harry took on all the tips and advice he could and now has a bowling action to envy, rarely bowling a bad ball by seasons end. In the field he is a player you don't want to take on, his accuracy and speed meant we lost count on the number of direct hit runouts he pulled off. Harry's positivity and desire to learn is a great example and motivator for those around him, players and coaches included.

NOAH HOLT: Noah is another natural athlete and was the reason for this team getting together to begin with. His enthusiasm is infectious to his teammates, and his highlight reel is memorable. Noah bowled some of the seasons best spells and showed raw pace on his day. His running between wickets was excellent and he consistently found the boundary. His fielding and throwing resulted in many mix ups and run outs. Noah, thank you for being the driving force to bring this group together.

MACK JOHNSTONE: Mack would run through walls to win and has probably tried, evidenced by the number of wicketkeepers he cleaned up when diving to make his ground. Always positive, always helping his mates and a pleasure to have around, Mack is a natural ball striker with a great eye. When bowling, Mack started the season as a player I thought would take years to teach, but by Christmas he was consistently hitting the stumps and by seasons end became one of our best, with a nice fluent action and decent pace. I don't think we saw a better fielder than Mack in the entire 10E competition, his speed to the ball and throwing accuracy is something to behold of an 8-year-old.

XANDER NASH: Xander is an outstanding team-oriented person. Positive, coachable, always looking to get better but more than anything else - he wants to have fun and make sure everyone around him is having fun. Out of nowhere his bowling action developed into something that all cricketers would envy. Xander consistently hit a good line and length at good pace. His batting improved and he could always be relied upon for boundaries when we needed them. Xanders biggest contribution on the field though was the way he celebrated team success, the first to run in and crash tackle a teammate after a catch or wicket.

KOA SANT: Rivals anyone for his competitive streak and determination to succeed, Koa would train and play 24/7 if we let him. Always the last to leave training and it shows in his performances. Koa was one of our most consistent batsmen all season and could always be relied upon for runs. Koa shows how enthusiasm in the field puts pressure on the opposition and creates wickets and led by example with the ball. Another player with a smooth, rhythmic bowling action, Koa rarely bowls a bad ball. Excess bounce cost Koa more than a few wickets and he will continue to improve over the years of cricket ahead of him.

Thanks very much to everyone involved, we all had a fantastic summer and look forward to doing it all over again next season.

12A COACHES REPORT



THE 2025/2026 U12A SEASON BEGAN WITH PLENTY OF EXCITEMENT AND ANTICIPATION. WITH SIX BOYS RETURNING FOR THEIR SECOND YEAR AND SEVERAL STEPPING UP FROM 12BS OR REPRESENTATIVE CRICKET, THE SQUAD CAME TOGETHER WITH A GREAT MIX OF EXPERIENCE, TALENT, AND ENTHUSIASM. ACROSS THE SEASON, THE BOYS SHOWED TREMENDOUS GROWTH, BOTH AS CRICKETERS AND AS YOUNG PEOPLE. THEIR DEVELOPMENT WAS REFLECTED IN AN OUTSTANDING ACHIEVEMENT: OUR TEAM CLAIMED ALL THREE MAJOR INDIVIDUAL AWARDS IN THE 12A COMPETITION—BATTING, BOWLING, AND FIELDING—WHILE ALSO FINISHING THE YEAR AS BOTH MINOR PREMIERS AND PREMIERS, A TRULY REMARKABLE ACCOMPLISHMENT.

From the opening match against Bangor—where we posted 158 for 3 and bowled them out for 90—it was clear this was going to be a special season. The boys consistently set high standards with bat and ball, posting scores of 150+ on ten occasions (including five over 200, with a season high of 5/245) and bowling opposition sides out 12 times. A standout was our game against the Seagulls, finishing on an incredible 0/206 from 30 overs.

What set this team apart was its depth. If one player had an off day, someone else always stood up. We could bat confidently from 1 through to 9, and everyone contributed with the ball. Beyond the results, the boys’ camaraderie and team spirit were exceptional. The friendships, support, and maturity they showed made me incredibly proud as both coach and dad. Our grand final celebration, shared by players and parents, perfectly capped off an unforgettable year.

A huge thank you to all the parents for their tireless support—helping at training, scoring, setting up grounds, and backing up for Representative cricket. Your commitment and positivity made the season extra special. Finally, thank you to our outstanding team manager, Ryan. You made coaching a breeze with your organisation, dedication, and generosity, even hosting our grand final celebrations at your home.

SHAHEER BABAR: Shaheer put together a cracking all-round season, contributing consistently with both bat and ball. He regularly gave us solid starts at the top and had a knack for picking up wickets right when we needed them most. His ability to swing momentum our way was invaluable. Add to that his quirky comments in the field, there was never a dull moment when Shaheer was around.

ETHAN COCKS: Ethan proved that line, length, and attacking the stumps are king; finishing as the top wicket-taker for both club and competition for the second year running, while also setting a new 12A record for most wickets in a season: an outstanding achievement. While he did find some very creative ways to get himself out with the bat, his energy and positivity in the field were infectious and always helped lift the team.

HUGO ETTRIDGE: Our resident lefthander, Hugo batted just about everywhere in the line-up before settling into a key top-order role. He had an impressive ability to change the flow of the game, sometimes helped along by his “interesting” running between wickets, which regularly kickstarted our scoring rate. Hugo stepped up as our main wicketkeeper this season and grew in confidence with every game.

CLAYTON GLOSSOP: Although Clayton only played half the season, he was an important contributor whenever he pulled on the Caringbah shirt. Whether opening the batting and getting us off to a flyer, or coming in through the middle and lower order to keep the runs ticking over, Clayton played his role perfectly and added real value to the team’s success.

CRUZ LAWS: A genuine matchwinner and true allrounder. Cruz had an outstanding season; with the bat, he could take the game apart, scoring multiple 50s throughout the year. In the field, his skills were well beyond his age, and with the ball, his raw pace often had opposition batters just trying to survive. His performances were

rightly recognised as he finished the season with the most runs in the competition and also took out the fielding award for most catches.

TAJ LAWS: A dependable toporder batter, Taj locked down the opening spot week in, week out and applied himself superbly. Taj often got us off to strong starts by setting the tone early and building solid foundations. With the ball, Taj was equally valuable; his ability to tie batters down and his real knack for bowling to lefthanders made him a key weapon in our attack. Taj also stepped up behind the stumps, and his sharp glove work helped get us through those opening rounds smoothly.

SETH TABONE: Seth burst onto the season with a flurry of early wickets and continued to bowl strongly all year. While the rewards didn’t always show up on the stats sheet, his tight, disciplined bowling consistently built pressure and played a huge role in setting up wickets for others. With the bat, Seth settled into a reliable middle order role, and whenever we lost quick early wickets, he had the ability to put his head down, dig in, and get us out of trouble. On more than one occasion, his calm approach helped steady the ship and turn a tricky situation back in our favour.

MATTHEW TAYLOR: Mr Consistent in every sense of the word, Matt delivered time and time again with both bat and ball. He has a great knack for taking wickets right when the team needs a breakthrough and scoring runs by constantly keeping the scoreboard moving. His calm leadership in the field, combined with an infectious positive attitude, often helped swing momentum back in our favour. These qualities didn’t go unnoticed, and he was rightly rewarded by being named captain for the finals series, making Matt the Premiership Captain of the 2025/2026 U12As, a fantastic achievement and a role he embraced brilliantly.

HARRY THOMPSON: Harry’s season was a bit of a rollercoaster, as he juggled school, club cricket and some unfortunate injuries. Despite this, Harry was the ultimate team player, turning up to every game to support his teammates, even when sidelined. His patience with the bat and ability to see off bowlers helped steady the innings on multiple occasions. Harry also spent time behind the stumps, growing in confidence as a wicketkeeper as the season went on. One moment that perfectly sums up his teamfirst attitude was seeing out an entire game wicketkeeping with a broken finger, something I only found out about after the match. That level of toughness and commitment is a huge credit to him as both a cricketer and a young man.

ZAC WILCOCKS: Zac was a pleasure to watch and an absolute asset to the team. His patience and respect for his wicket stood out every time he went to the crease, regardless of where he batted in the order. He eventually earned his spot as one of our opening batters and consistently did exactly what was asked of him—seeing off the opposition’s opening bowlers and giving us strong starts. With the ball, Zac provided real variety as a leftarm option, bowling tight, disciplined spells and building pressure. His willingness to play whatever role the team needed each week, combined with his positive attitude and strong work ethic, made him a highly valued member of this squad.

REGARDLESS OF THE RESULT, THE BOYS CAN BE INCREDIBLY PROUD OF THEIR EFFORTS. THEIR SKILL, SPIRIT, AND SPORTSMANSHIP WERE OUTSTANDING, AND THEIR IMPROVEMENT AS BOTH INDIVIDUALS AND AS A TEAM WAS CLEAR TO SEE THROUGHOUT THE SEASON. OUR BOWLING AND FIELDING PERFORMANCES WERE A JOY TO WATCH (AND UMPIRE), AND EVERY PLAYER STEPPED UP WITH THE BAT AT KEY MOMENTS DURING THE YEAR. LYLE ANDREWS: Lyle quickly established himself as one of the leading pace bowlers in the competition, combining consistent line and length with a deadly yorker that regularly caused havoc for opposition batters. With the bat, Lyle is developing into a solid batsman, with a growing range of shots and a knack for hitting big boundaries. An energetic presence in the field and a great teammate.

ETHAN BEATTIE: A mercurial leg spinner with a full bag of tricks, Ethan also provided plenty of firepower in the middle order. He showed strong game awareness with the ball and had a knack for turning matches in our favour at key moments. With the bat, his aggressive stroke play and running between wickets could quickly shift momentum. As his patience grows, so too will his batting. A respectful player and a pleasure to coach.

CRUZ DONOHUE: Cruz enjoyed an excellent season, developing his trademark left-arm inswingers to great effect, finishing with 19 wickets at an average of 10.37. His standout performance of 4 for 5 against Illawong was a highlight for the team. Cruz also made significant strides in the field, taking several impressive catches late in the season. With the bat, he played with a straight technique and produced some lovely drives. Easy to coach, Cruz gets down to business and lets his cricket do the talking.

OSCAR DUFF: One of our young guns, Oscar played a key role in our pace attack, improving his run-up and balance throughout the season. He was often unlucky not to take more wickets. In the field, he was reliable in the slips and carried himself well as vice-captain at the toss. Oscar should do well backing up in the U12's again next season.

FINN GLADMAN: Finn contributed across all areas of the game, whether it was stylish top-order batting, super economical bowling, or safe hands in the field. Known for his strong off-side play, he showed resilience opening the batting in key matches. His bowling improved with added accuracy and variation, including a very effective slower ball. In the field, Finn held onto some superb catches and showed his usual enthusiasm at training.

JAXON HASSAN: Jaxon has a fantastic attitude for the game. His calm mindset and smart shot selection saw him finish as one of the leading run-scorers in the competition, amassing 426 runs at an outstanding average

of 60.86. He controlled innings beautifully, including a match-winning 48* against Engadine, finishing the game with a six and a four. Behind the stumps, he was excellent, keeping byes to a minimum. A talented wicketkeeper who just needs to add a bit more volume to his appeals!

NATE HEATH: A passionate cricketer, Nate developed his ability to swing the ball both ways while improving his pace and accuracy throughout the season. He regularly provided important early breakthroughs. With the bat, Nate showed resilience and determination, highlighted by a valuable 31* in a tough situation against Caringbah 2's. His energy in the field and encouragement of teammates were invaluable.

SAMUEL JORDAN: Sam had a strong all-round season, emerging as one of the competition's leading wicket-takers with 21 wickets at an average of 11.29. It was great to see the team rally behind Sam when he beat the batsmen with flight and spin. With the bat, he contributed important runs by rotating strike and running hard between wickets. One of the smallest yet loudest in the field, batsmen were wary of running a single with Sam fielding at point.

JAXSON MCINNES: Jaxson can be proud of an excellent season, stepping up as an opening batter in high-pressure situations. He proved very difficult to dismiss, finishing with eight not-out innings, including a composed 36* in a close game against Illawong. Jaxson's bowling improved steadily, particularly when pitching the ball up. As one of the senior members of the team, Jaxson was invariably the first to give a teammate a hand at training or offer a word of encouragement from the sidelines.

NATE MORTENSEN: Nate enjoyed a standout season with the bat, scoring 398 runs at an average of 56.86. After starting the season with two quick half-centuries, he showed great development by learning when to balance attack with defence against stronger bowling. Nate's bowling also became a valuable asset later in the season, with improved consistency. In the field, Nate brought energy and pulled off several excellent catches.

DESPITE WHAT THE FINAL TABLE SUGGESTS, IT WAS A VERY SUCCESSFUL AND ENJOYABLE SEASON FOR THE 12C'S. THE BOYS COMPETED EXTREMELY HARD WEEK IN, WEEK OUT, WERE ALWAYS IN THE CONTEST, AND PUSHED SOME OF THE TOP TEAMS TO THEIR LIMITS, SHOWING WE WOULD NOT HAVE LOOKED OUT OF PLACE IN THE FINALS. WITH PLENTY OF TIGHT FINISHES AND A FEW UNLUCKY MOMENTS, THE RESULTS DIDN'T ALWAYS GO OUR WAY. HOWEVER, THE BOYS' DEVELOPMENT AND THE EXPERIENCE GAINED THROUGH THOSE CLOSE MATCHES WAS UNDENIABLE.

Our bowling was a real strength, with genuine pace in the line-up complemented by spin options that developed nicely as the season progressed. Our batting started slowly but improved rapidly, with some gritty and determined performances on display at key stages.

A big thank you to all the parents for their support throughout the season and for making my job easy. In particular, Michelle for keeping everything organised, and Dave and Brett for stepping in to help when I was away.

ARCHER ADAMSKI: From the first training session, it was clear Archer would be one of our go-to bowlers, with his consistent line and length and natural pace on display straight away. This was reflected in his 15 wickets at an impressive average of 12.73. If LBWs were in play in U12s, he may well have added another 10 to that tally. Archer's batting also developed nicely, showing grit and determination when required. His 32 against Bosco, including a 64-run last wicket partnership with Luke, was a highlight, falling agonisingly short by just one run. As our youngest player (still eligible for U10s), Archie has a very bright future ahead.

JAX BARNETT: Jax was one of our early-season aggressors with the bat and among our most consistent performers in the first half of the season, helping lay the platform for strong totals with clean, confident hitting. His left-arm bowling added variety, with changes in pace deceiving batters and earning key wickets at important moments, he was unlucky not to have more to his name. Jax's leadership and voice in the field were outstanding, keeping the team focused and energised.

FLYNN BATTY: Flynn was our "Mr Fix-It", always willing to step in wherever needed, opening the batting against quick attacks or taking the gloves when required. He became our regular wicketkeeper in the second half of the season, providing a safe and reliable presence behind the stumps. His batting grew in confidence as the season progressed, developing into one of our most consistent performers. His 43 not out off 46 balls was a standout innings. Flynn also contributed with the ball, taking 7 wickets to round out a strong all-round season.

HAYDEN GIBSON: "Haydos" really found his rhythm with the ball this season, shortening his run-up and developing consistency in his line and length. Combined with good variation in pace, he became a real handful for opposition batters. All 8 of his wickets came in the second half of the season, highlighting his growth. With the bat, Hayden has an aggressive mindset and a full range of shots. With continued focus on balancing attack and defense, there are plenty of runs ahead for him.

LUKE GLEESON: Always in the contest, Luke's tenacity and work ethic saw him finish as both our leading run scorer and wicket taker, notching up 263 runs and an impressive 16 wickets. Luke worked tirelessly at training and developed a

consistent outswinger, a credit to his dedication. His strong defensive technique underpinned several gritty innings, while his ability to find gaps and rotate strike led to two well-earned half-centuries. An outstanding all-round season.

BOSTON KARAURIA-HENRY: In his first year of cricket, Boston quickly showed he had natural ability. While initially raw, he developed rapidly into a key player across all facets of the game. His batting technique became solid early on, and he consistently scored at a good pace, with multiple 30s and a standout 51 not out in the final match. With the ball, he developed into a genuine fast bowler by season's end, generating raw pace that sent fear through opposing batting lineups. His 6 wickets don't accurately reflect the impact his bowling had on most contests. Add to the mix Boston's excellent fielding and we have a genuine all-round cricketer on our hands.

KAI NYE: Kai was a steady and reliable performer with both bat and ball. His confidence with the bat was building nicely, supported by solid stroke play. His medium pace bowling was extremely economical, finishing with the best economy rate in the team at 2.45. Unfortunately, other commitments limited him to 7 matches, so we didn't get to see the full potential of what Kai has to offer.

LACHLAN PODESTA: A natural athlete with strong all-round ability, Lachy was always involved in the game with his consistent batting, fast bowling and agile fielding. His bowling improved significantly, adding pace to become one of our strike weapons, finishing with 14 wickets at 13.57. With the bat, he was our second-highest run scorer (245runs at an average of 24.5), combining a sound technique with a reliable straight drive. His unbeaten 37 to guide us to victory over Bosco was a standout performance.

JACK ROWLING: One of only two players to feature in every game, Jack was always reliable when called upon to do the hard yards with the bat and ball. Jack bowls a heavy ball and gets good bounce off the pitch and was a handful for opposition batters when he had his line and length dialed in. Jack can count himself very unlucky not to have taken more wickets this year. With the bat, Jack developed noticeable power, highlighted by his unbeaten 31 against Bangor.

HUGO WITHERS: Hugo brought infectious energy and humour to the team, along with strong leadership both on and off the field. He was also arguably the most improved player from last season. Hugo's batting became a real weapon early in the year, with powerful hitting that surprised even himself at times. Midway through the season, he added another string to his bow by becoming a leg spinner, and a handy one at that, collecting 8 wickets. I look forward to seeing Hugo progress even further next year.

AT THE START OF THE SEASON, WHEN LOOKING AT OUR SQUAD “ON PAPER”, I THOUGHT THAT IF WE COULD TRANSLATE OUR TALENT INTO PERFORMANCE, WE WOULD BE VERY HARD TO BEAT. WE HAD EXCELLENT DEPTH WITH BOTH BAT AND BALL, AND THIS WAS REFLECTED IN OUR TEAM STATISTICS WHERE 8 OF OUR 13 BATTERS AVERAGED 25 OR MORE, WHILE 6 BOWLERS AVERAGED 13 OR LESS. THE TEAM SHOULD BE VERY PROUD OF THE WAY THEY PERFORMED THROUGHOUT THE SEASON AND HOW THEY CONDUCTED THEMSELVES ON THE FIELD. I’d like to thank all the parents for their commitment throughout the season, and in particular Brendan and Stu for their support, advice, and assistance along the way. I hope to see you all in some capacity next season, but in the meantime, enjoy the off season.

BRYSON BAGNALL: Bryson was one of the most impactful players in the team this season, with bowling figures among the best in the competition. He claimed 17 wickets at an outstanding average of 11.59. Bryon’s disciplined, pressure-building style will serve him well in the years to come. One of the most pleasing aspects of Bryson’s game was his improvement and attitude with the bat, contributing 151 runs at 25.17, including a top score of 41 not out. Bryson’s aggressive approach and ball striking ability will be a real asset in the U16’s next season.

ZAC BROWN: Having coached Zac since he was 6 years old, it has been fantastic to watch his progression. Zac also made strong contributions with the bat, scoring 179 runs at 25.57, including two half-centuries. His 64 in the Grand Final, played in blistering heat, set up our innings and gave our bowlers a strong total to bowl at.

JACK FLEMING: Jack is a naturally powerful striker of the ball, playing with an aggressive mindset. He recorded the highest strike rate in the team (84.85) and contributed valuable quick runs when needed. With more time in the middle and improved shot selection, Jack can certainly be a dangerous player. Injuries limited his bowling early in the season, but his performances late in the year and at training showed there is something to work with going into next season.

NOLAN GRANTHAM: With a busy schedule with school cricket and athletics, Nolan’s availability was limited, but in his three matches he made a strong impact—averaging 26 with the bat and 10 with the ball. Nolan has a great cricketing brain and reads the game better than most at his age. It was great to have him involved whenever he was available.

RHYS JEWELL: Rhys was one of the standout performers of the season, making a significant impact with both bat and ball. He scored 354 runs at an average of 39.33, including three half-centuries. With the ball, he claimed 16 wickets at an excellent average of 11.50. Rhys saved his best for the Grand Final, where he compiled an extremely important 68 and took 4 for 15 in a damaging display with the ball. Rhys captained us for most of the season and led admirably showing intelligent and thoughtful planning.

JACK JOHNSON: In his first season with the club, Jack proved to be a valuable all-round addition. He scored 222 runs at 24.67, including a top score of 47 not out, often contributing in difficult situations with a mix of timing and controlled aggression. While his bowling figures didn’t fully reflect his efforts, he showed his capability in the Grand Final with two key wickets and tight spells under pressure. Equal leading catcher with 6 snares, a great all round first season with the club.

LINCOLN JONES: Lincoln played several important innings this season, demonstrating a strong technique and a unique ability to go through the gears depending on the game situation. He scored 237 runs at an average of 33.86, including a magnificent 87 not out against the competition finalists in Round 5. Behind the stumps, Lincoln was sharp and dependable, taking 10 catches, along

with 2 more in the field. Lincoln was also one of our leading tacticians and his cricket brain and understanding of the game is improving with each season.

THOMAS LANGLEY: Tom was one of the team’s most effective bowlers, finishing with 12 wickets at an impressive average of 13.33, including best figures of 3 for 10. With the bat, he produced a standout innings of 41 (off 57 balls, including seven boundaries). Tom has a great eye and as he develops his shot selection, he’ll turn those starts into big scores. Tom is a much loved and popular member of the team. He always brings a positive attitude particularly in the field where Ton’s athleticism is used in heavy traffic field positions.

HUGH MATHESON: Hugh was a model of consistency with the ball, taking 11 wickets at 22.27 with an excellent economy rate of 3.15., a testament to his discipline and control. At this age, taking large hauls of wickets bowling good balls can be a challenge but it was Hugh’s control which impressed the most, in particular Hugh’s fantastic spell in the Grand Final where he returned 1-30 off his 10 overs. Hugh worked hard on his batting and made great inroads especially rotating the strike late in the innings. A nicer kid you won’t meet!

EWAN MCNEIL: Ewan had an exceptional season with the ball and deserves enormous credit for the impact he had on the team’s bowling attack. He finished as joint-leading wicket-taker with 17 wickets at an outstanding average of 10.29, along with an economy rate of 2.69 and a remarkable 17 maiden overs, the most in the squad. Ewan is working hard on his batting and we both know that he certainly has the ability to construct very valuable innings for the club in the future. Ewan has a great attitude for learning and is always looking at ways to improve all aspects of his game. A pleasure to coach.

ISSAC MURRAY: The best players seem to have time, and Issac has this in spades. I’ve got no doubt that if given more opportunity, Issac would have been in the top 5 run scorers in the competition. He showed great maturity playing his first year in the U14’s scoring 277 runs across 10 innings at an average of 34.63 with three half centuries. Issac impressed in the field as well, quick across the ground with good anticipation led to headaches for the opposition when running between the wickets. A great team man and one to watch in the future.

KRIS PATEL: It’s never a dull moment with Kris! A naturally aggressive stroke-maker, he has the ability to change the course of a game in a matter of overs. Kris is a beautiful timer of the ball, and it was great to see him represent Sutherland this year in the Anthony Neale Cup. He scored 225 runs at an average of 28.13, with a lively strike rate of 76.79. With the ball, Kris contributed 6 wickets at 17.0, and with further development of his swing bowling, he has the potential to become an even more valuable all-rounder. A great set of hands and a great team player, every team could do with a Kris!

CAMERON REED: Cam was the team’s most economical bowler this season, finishing with 12 wickets at an outstanding average of 9.92 and an economy rate of just 2.43. Cam consistently threatened the batters while giving very little away, his tight spells in the Semi Final and Grand Final were a testament to his discipline. A gun fielder and great between the wickets makes Cam a very valuable all round in out team. With the bat, Cam proved to be a reliable partner at the crease, highlighted by his 33 against a strong GyMEA Bay 1 bowling attack.

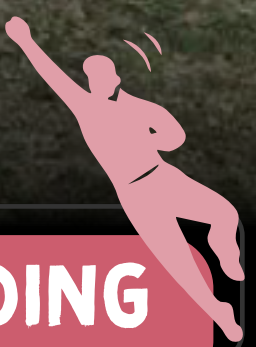
